SMSA SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION PROCESS

Scholarships are awarded for accredited four-year bachelor's degrees, two-year associate degrees or Career & Technical Education (CTE) degrees (12-18-month career and technical education programs). We do not provide scholarships for graduate school, part-time programs or great-grandchildren.

Scholarship awards may be used for tuition, books and academic-related fees. Scholarships are renewable for up to four years, provided recipient meets academic requirements.

SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AWARDED TO THE CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN OF A SEABEE OR CIVIL ENGINEER CORPS (CEC) OFFICER:

- Eligible sponsors are enlisted personnel with a Seabee rating, CEC officers, or others who have served or are serving in a Naval Construction Force Unit. This includes members of other service branches assigned to a Seabee unit. Active duty, reserve, retired and honorably discharged Seabee children and grandchildren are eligible to apply.
- **The scholarship deadline is April 15, 2024.** Applications must be completed online and submitted no later than this date. The application will be available at www.seabee.org/scholarship

REQUIRED APPLICATION DOCUMENTS:

- Online application – available January 1, 2024 on our website (www.seabee.org/scholarship)
- Verification of sponsor's eligibility as a Seabee, CEC officer or service with a Seabee unit. Acceptable official documents include DD-214, discharge or reenlistment certificates or current active-duty orders.
- Student Aid Report showing Expected Family Contribution amount from Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Summary of extracurricular activities and awards (school and community)
- Summary of applicant employment history (employers, dates and description of responsibilities)
- Official transcript with unweighted GPA
- Letter of Recommendation
- Essay

Failure to submit a complete application with the correct required information will result in disqualification.

DECEMBER 2023



28 December 1941 - In a letter to the Bureau of Navigation dated 28 December 1941, the Chief of the Bureau of Yards and Docks wrote that construction work on advance bases in combat zones could be carried on satisfactorily only by the utilization of military personnel under direct military command. Admiral Moreell recommended that "early steps should be taken toward the organization of such military construction forces if they are to be trained and available at the times their services will be required." Admiral Moreell pointed out in this letter that not less than 12 construction companies of 226 men each should be available for assignment to duty at locations outside the continental limits.

MARCH 2024



14 March 1966 - The first of six echelons of NMCB 1 arrived in Vietnam. The battalion thus became the first Atlantic battalion to take part in the Vietnam War. Its primary tasks during this tour of duty were the construction of the Camp Haskins complex for the Thirtieth Naval Construction Regiment headquarters, a Seabee battalion camp, and a cantonment for the Force Logistic Support Group.

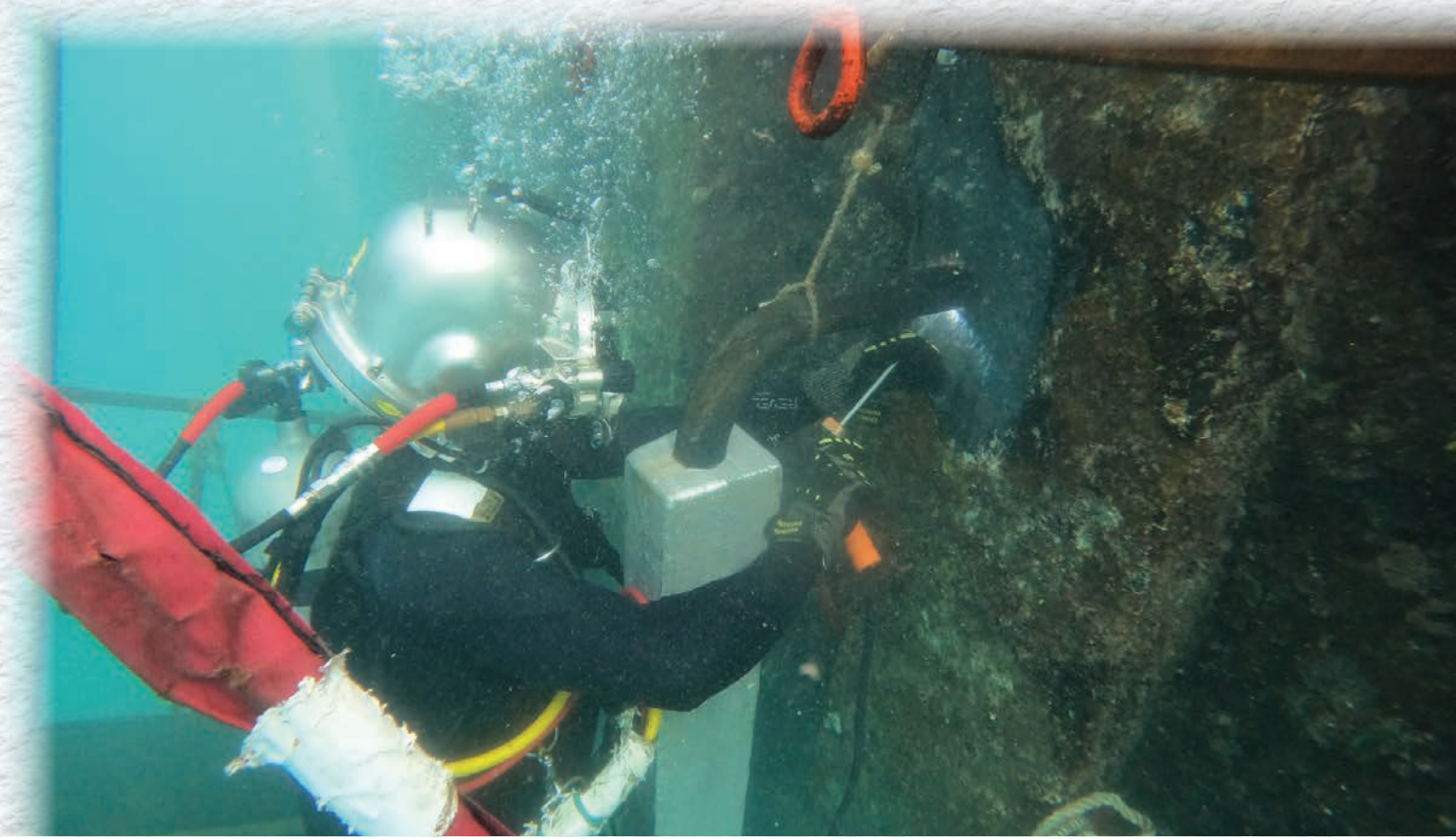
